*** OISS Fall 2020 Semester Drop-In Advising Hours:**

Tuesdays from 8:30am to 10am EST

Thursdays from 11:30am- 1pm EST

All you need to do to attend the OISS Drop-In Advising Hours is:

1. Register by filling out this [Google Form](#)
2. Receive the Drop-In Advising Zoom link upon completing the form.
3. Click on the link during the Drop-In Advising hours (Tuesday 8:30am - 10am & Thursday 11:30am - 1pm) - Speak to an OISS advisor!

Drop-in advising sessions are 15 minutes each, so if you require more than 15 minutes, a scheduled appointment with an advisor is recommended and can be scheduled at: oiss@risd.edu.

*** You may schedule an online Zoom appointment with an advisor by calling or emailing OISS.** We have access to other modes of communication too (WhatsApp, WeChat, KakaoTalk, LINE, Skype)- just ask! We will continue to use the virtual space for our advising sessions during the Fall 2020 term.

*** OISS hours are Monday- Friday, 8:30am- 4:30pm EST;** however, exceptions will be made on a case-by-case basis with the understanding that many of you are in different time zones and outside of the U.S. We will find a time that works for you.

-----IMMIGRATION UPDATES-----

Travel-Related

I-20 Travel Signatures: We have *temporarily* modified some of our processes regarding the I-20 Travel Signature due to COVID-19. The temporary changes have

been guided by the SEVP (Student & Exchange Visitor Program) [Broadcast Message 2003-03](#): New Electronic Form I-20 Issuance Guidance on ICE.gov/COVID19 sent on March 26, 2020. If you needed to leave the United States urgently and were not able to obtain a Travel Signature on page 2 of your I-20, we can scan one for you! While the I-20 usually requires an ORIGINAL signature on the I-20, SEVP has allowed this temporary adjustment.

[New Students who are in the United States](#) - you do not require a travel signature on your I-20 until the next time you plan to leave the U.S. We will send more information on winter break travel in November. It is not recommended that you travel during the Thanksgiving break due to the global pandemic.

Note About Travel- If you are currently in the United States with plans to work or study here in the near future, traveling outside of the U.S. is not recommended. *With the current travel restrictions in the U.S. and in many other countries, when you might be able to return to the United States is unknown. This is not immigration-specific, but rather related to the global pandemic and the travel restrictions that are country-specific. Many are still not allowing for international travel- the U.S. included. Please contact oiiss@risd.edu with any questions specific to your situation.*

Routine Visa Services- Continued Slow Reopening: U.S. embassies and consulates have continued with their “phased resumption of routine visa services” and there are still delays. We encourage you to monitor the embassies and consulates in your home country as appointment availability will depend on local conditions.

Note About Visas- *If you are physically in the United States and your visa will be expiring, you can remain in the U.S. on an expired visa as long as you have a valid I-20.*

Maintaining your Immigration Status

Please see the ATTACHED CHART to see the modality of learning you must be engaged in so you are maintaining your F-1 Immigration Status.

In addition to being enrolled in specific modalities of learning to maintain your F-1 status, you must also be enrolled in AT LEAST 12 credits to be considered a full-time student. You CANNOT drop below 12 credits without the appropriate authorization from OISS. Please email oiiss@risd.edu with any questions you might have.

Other Things to Consider:

Be Aware of Possible Scams!- IMPORTANT!!! There have recently been many RISD international students who have reported receiving phone calls from people claiming that they are U.S. government (IRS or Social Security Administration), COVID contact tracers and other government officials (including people from outside of the U.S.) that are demanding money or personal information or threatening their immigration status. **DO NOT GIVE THEM ANYTHING!!!** These types of calls are considered Scams and we do not want any of our students to be harmed by them. In general- No U.S. Government Offices will ever call you and demand money by phone! Just hang up!

Protesting: If you are (or if you already have) protesting with the Black Lives Matter Movement, we recommend that you visit the [ACLU \(American Civil Liberties Union\) website](#) to get familiar with what your rights are for protesting on a non-immigrant visa in the U.S. Be safe and don't go alone!

Finally, some of you may have heard that there may be changes on the "Duration of Status" notation on your visa stamp and your I-94 Admission document. Please visit the, "[Proposal to Replace Duration of Status](#)" overview from NAFSA: Association of International Educators for more information.

The Rhode Island School of Design and the RISD Office of International Student Services are opposed to this proposal, and we will be registering objections with the US Department of Homeland Security.
